During the semester, I have been working compassion ministry with drug addicts and alcoholics as part of Jesus' ministry. The whole family gets involved. We serve up to 120 meals on a Wednesday. Clare cooks every 2 months or so. She gets a gang together to do this. When she is not cooking, we all help in the kitchen or get the Church ready. Kiri helps out with the children's ministry for those who come along and then we all eat and talk with those who come.

The Vineyard has a regular congregation on Sunday of 320. I have been asked to preach at the end of the month. This is a bit of a



blow! I had not expected that. I haven't accepted either. If the Bible College get to know – which is very likely, there will be an extra large congregation that Sunday! I guess I will do it.

Apparently it's the longest and worst CASA exam; 3.5 hrs of a 5 hour session. It was particularly hard. It's for a Commercial Command Instrument Rating, that's to fly in cloud or at night and for arrival and approach procedures using instruments including the ILS (instrument landing system).

This means the next part of my flight training can start; that's 30 hours of instrument flying and



two flight exams for the first module. First off is getting my night qualification. Eeeks!

At the Mission Aviation centre I will be moving onto the 206 which is the Cessna 200 range of aircraft with MAF soon. These are the mission aircraft with 7 seats. I am looking forward to it. It's a very famous aircraft and the one here at Coldstream is from the Cambodian mission field. In fact the pilot and his wife, Winston and Ruth Usher who started and served in MAF Cambodia for 12 years, are coming

to lunch on Sunday. They have been friends ever since we arrived at the Bible College. I think they already have plans for us to take over the Cambodian operation from them! They are ready to retire.

Its colder now – a bit like English spring weather - some fog but we are always able to fly.
