Myself with Steve Barton are Bible from the local people as a measure of their appreciation of the work MAF and Wycliffe has done in supporting them for the last 30 years.


### 30 Years Work...

Just in this highland village, this represents over 750 souls. What a wonderful reason for celebration! With small changes, this Bible will be able to be used by similar language groups in the area. What a wonderful seed has been planted.

Access by aircraft replaced a drive, followed by a canoe trip for many miles to the bottom of the mountain before a 3,700ft climb up the cliff. MAF has been involved here for many years. Tom Sinclair, a former MAF pilot installed the chimney stack in their house many years ago.


### Marawake Hydro Power Opening Ceremony
